SPOOKY SPIDER WEBS


MAKE & TALK CRAFT

TO MAKE A PAPER WEB, YOU WILL NEED


- **PAPER**
- SCISSORS
- STRING OR THREAD



Start with a sheet of A4/printer size (or bigger) paper and lay it flat on a surface.




Fold the top right corner across the paper to meet the left edge of the paper. The corners won't meet, but the folded section should create a perfect triangle - see the photo if you are confused.



You will need to use scissors a lot for this activity, so please ask a grown-up for help or use safety scissors. Cut off the leftover paper below the folded triangle shape.








Fold the triangle in half again to create a smaller triangle.



Fold again to create another smaller triangle.




Then fold one more time to make a cone shape.



Carefully cut off the leftover paper. You should now have a triangle that has two long sides and one short side.



On the short side, carefully cut a curve or an arc from edge to edge (see the photo above).



Cut out rectangles across the triangle – these rectangles will create the lines of the web! Make sure to only cut from one of the long edges and don't cut all the way across.





Gently unfold your triangles to reveal your spider web! Wow!



Carefully poke a piece of string through one of the holes on the outer edge of the web and tie a knot. Don't pull too tightly because it could rip the paper.

TO MAKE THE SPIDER, YOU WILL NEED

- BLACK PAPER
- SCISSORS
- **GLUE**
- GOOGLY EYES



Using black paper or paper you've coloured in, cut out one small circle and one larger round or oval shape – these will be the head and body of your spider!



Cut out four long and thin rectangles. They should be much longer than the body of your spider – these will be legs!



Glue the small circle to the top edge of the bigger round shape.







Take the four long and thin rectangles, and glue them across the bigger round shape so you can see them on each side of the spider's body.



Make the legs bend by gently folding the rectangles halfway along them - this will make the shape of spider legs.



Then fold or crease the parts of the legs that are closest to the body - this will make sure your spider can stand up!



If you have googly eyes, stick them onto the head. If not, you could draw them on or cut out small white circles and glue them on.



To attach the spider to the web, poke some of the legs through the holes on the web. You can also glue or tape them on if you want to.



Hang your web and spider up somewhere, and you have got a spooky spider web perfect for Halloween!
